Comment: My concerns are regarding business type, parking, deliveries and bins. For far has a large number of takeaway businesses and I do not see the need for 2 similar type businesses being situated next door to each other in a town of Forfar's size. The small car park in Myre Road is owned and run by the local authority and has 3 parking bays and 4 disabled parking bays. Onstreet parking in Castle Street is limited. Deliveries via the front of the premises is impractical on account of its location on this very busy street, and any deliveries would undoubtedly impact greatly on the movement of traffic and there would be a concern for road safety for all users on Castle Street. Deliveries would, I assume, be via this small car park. This is a public car park which is already used for deliveries by a couple of neighbouring businesses. Extra deliveries will create further inconvenience by blocking parking access to the public and to the residential property which has vehicular access from this car park. This will also have a detrimental effect on patients attending the Grekin Clinic which sits within this car park area. Clinic rooms are in very close proximity to the car park and there would be additional noise and disruption to patients during their treatments. Deliveries would be made via the (fire exit?) door at the rear of the property, which is part of the Grekin Clinic building. With no apparent facility for bin storage the additional bins will be situated within the car park, alongside bins for other neighbouring businesses. These will further encroach upon/block at least one disabled parking bay. All these parking spaces, especially the disabled bays, are in frequent use and extra bins will create further obstruction and possibly prove to be a danger to car owners and their vehicles.

I strongly object on the basis that we need to protect what we have left, make it all unique and aim for longevity of what's in situ.

The biggest decline in the town was when the council relocated out of town, many councils in Scotland have recognised that fact and moved back in, support it don't kill it.
