Invitation to create Local Place Plans

As the Council are now in the early stages of preparation for the next Local Development Plan, we would like to formally invite communities/community groups to create and submit Local Place Plans (LPPs) for their area to help shape and influence Angus development within where they live.



As the adoption of the new Local Development Plan **Comhairle Aonghais** is likely to be in 2029, we would be grateful if local

communities could prepare and submit their Local Place Plans no later than the 31st December 2025, this is to allow them to be considered and incorporated where appropriate within the Local Development Plan.

As set out in the Participation Statement in the latest Development Plan Scheme 2023, there will be plenty of opportunities for everyone to engage and collaborate in the preparation of the new Local Development Plan, thereby ensuring that your views are heard and taken into account.

However, if you are part of a constituted community group then you have the right to prepare a Local Place Plan. Once registered, Local Place Plans are required to be taken into account during the preparation of the next Local Development Plan – therefore giving yourself, as a constituted community group, the authority to influence decisions and future development in your area of Angus.

To support our communities the Council will be able to provide advice and guidance on the creation of Local Place Plans alongside basic mapping of boundaries. More information on the resources available to aid in the creation of Local Place Plans are available on Angus Council's website.
