ABSTRACT

The purpose of this Report is to present applications for a new premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 which requires to be determined by the Board.

1. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended that the Board considers and determines the application for a new premises licence as detailed in the attached Appendix, in terms of one of the following options: -

- (i) to grant the application, subject to Statutory Conditions, and any other discretionary or local conditions which the Board may wish to impose;
- to propose a modification to the operating plan or layout plan (or both) and if the applicant accepts the proposed modification, request that the applicant amend the application and, thereafter, grant the modified application with the proposed amendment, subject to the Statutory Conditions and any other discretionary or local conditions which the Board may wish to impose;
- (iii) to defer the application to the next Licensing Board; or
- (iv) to refuse the application on one or more of the grounds referred to in Paragraph 4.

2. BACKGROUND

The Board has received an application for a new premises licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 which requires to be determined by the Board because the matters are not subject to delegation and can only be discharged by the Licensing Board.

3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications arising from this Report.

4. OTHER IMPLICATIONS

Legal

The Board must, in considering and determining each premises licence application, consider whether any of the grounds for refusal applies and: -

- (a) if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application, or
- (b) if any of them applies, the Board must refuse the application.

The grounds for refusal are: -

(a) that the subject premises are excluded premises,

- (b) that the application must be refused under Section 25(2) (the Board had previously refused a premises licence within the preceding one year), Section 64(2) (alcohol would be sold for a continuous period of 24 hours from the premises, unless there are exceptional circumstances which justify allowing the sale of alcohol on the premises during such a period), or Section 65(3) (if alcohol is to be sold for off sales purposes before 10am or after 10pm, or both),
- (c) that the Licensing Board consider, having regard to the licensing objectives, that the applicant is not a fit and proper person to be the holder of a premises licence,
- (d) that the Licensing Board considers that the granting of the application would otherwise be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives,
- (e) that, having regard to:
 - (i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises;
 - (ii) the location, character and condition of the premises, and
 - (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises

the Board considers that the premises are unsuitable for use for the sale of alcohol,

- (f) that the Board considers that, if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be overprovision of licensed premises, or licensed premises of the same or similar description as the subject premises, in the locality.
- (g) in considering whether either of the grounds for refusal specified in (c) or (d) applies, the Licensing Board must in particular take into account—
 - (a) any conviction, notice of which is given by the chief constable under subsection 4(b) of section 21 and
 - (b) any report given by the chief constable under section 24A(2).
- (h) Where the Licensing Board considers that—
 - (a) they would refuse the application as made, but
 - (b) if a modification proposed by them were made to the operating plan or layout plan (or both) for the subject premises accompanying the application, they would be able to grant the application,

the Board must, if the applicant accepts the proposed modification, grant the application as modified.

Where the Licensing Board refuses the application -

- (a) the Board must specify the ground for refusal, and
- (b) if the ground of refusal is that specified (c) or (d) above, the Board must specify the licensing objective or objectives in question.

The Board deferred this application on both dates to allow the applicant to carry out requests made by Fire Scotland. **The matter cannot be deferred again and must now be determined.**

Premises are a full-service convenience store situated in the centre of the county town of Forfar offering sale of groceries, off sales and carrying out occasional deliveries of groceries and alcohol

2. Core times when alcohol will be sold for consumption off the premises: -

Monday to Sunday 10.00 - 22.00

The Board are asked to note the hours requested are within Board Policy

3. Activities

Recorded music within and outwith core hours

4. Activities Outwith Core Hours

Recorded background music may be played and sale of goods other than alcohol may take place before, during and after core hours

5. Any Other Activities

Sale of groceries and other items commensurate with a full service convenience store and occasional deliveries of groceries and alcohol

The Board are advised a copy of the Note for delivery personnel, premises licence holders, premises managers and staff is attached.

6. Capacity

Accessible alcohol display area - 6.89 m2 Inaccessible alcohol display area - 3.82 m2 Total alcohol display area - 10.71 m2

Comments Received

Fire Scotland - noted the following observations of the layout plan attached to the application.


- A robust Fire Risk Assessment and Fire policy should be in place that considers all of the risks within the premises and provides clear fire safety management.
- The rear store area appears to show an inner, inner room.
- Travel distance may be excessive due to a single means of escape.
- Consideration should be given to extending the Fire Warning and Detection system to provide greater coverage and early warning of fire to relevant persons.


The Board are asked to note the observations from Fire Scotland were forwarded on to the agent, Janet Hood.

On 1 November 2023 the agent sent an email to Licensing and Fire Scotland with an image of a Fire Detection and Fire Alarm System Installation Certificate, a copy of which is attached to this report.

Fire Scotland advised on 2 November 2023 they are happy for the licence to be granted. However, they will be making Janet Hood aware that there is still a number of actions outstanding on the Fire Risk Assessment and there is an expectation that these would be actioned in a timeously manner. They will also be recommending that consideration is given to extending the Fire Alarm system to an L3 as was recommended by the Fire Risk Assessor. If they require any clarification on these points they should contact the risk assessor that they employed.

Licensing Standards Officer - confirmed no comments to make in respect of the application other than to request the Board add the 5 delivery conditions detailed in his report to the Board.







An application for a New Premises Licence was received on 7 September 2023 in respect of:

Tandooriwala, 97 - 99 North Street, Forfar, DD8 3BL Premises Licence Number: TBC

Background: -

This is an application for a new premises licence. As you will note from the location map the premises is located on North Street and is surrounded by residential and commercial properties. The application has been applied for by Mohammad Rafiqul Islam and has been applied for as an individual. The proposed premises manager will be Mohammad Mustafizur Rahman who currently holds a personal licence with Dundee City Council.

I visit the premises on 30th October 2023 and met with the applicant Mohammad Rafiqul Islam to discuss this application.

Licensing Standards Officer Report:

The application is for a restaurant situated on North Street, Forfar and is for on and off sales of alcohol. The premises have applied for and been granted occasional licences and as far as I am aware there have been no issues received in respect of these.

I discussed the matter of the activities selected in the proposed operating plan and highlighted that the applicant had selected 'YES' for restaurant facilities out with core hours but had not provided further details of this as requested in the application form. Mohammed confirmed that the premises would not provide restaurant facilities out with core hours and so asked for this to be amended to 'NO' on the operating plan.

The application indicates that delivery of alcohol will be an option and again I will discuss this with the applicant. I would suggest that if the Board are minded granting the application, then 5 delivery conditions be attached to the licence. This is to keep the premises in line with other premises that provide delivery of alcohol.

The five delivery conditions are as follows:

- 1. Alcohol sold or dispatched from the premises will be delivered only to residential or business addresses.
- 2. The Licenceholder shall always check the age of customers or potential customers, be satisfied that they are aged 18 years of over before any sale is completed and otherwise shall comply with the age-related sale provisions in the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.
- 3. Sales of Alcohol may only take place within licensed hours. Any person submitting an order out with the licensed hours is to be advised that the order will be processed after the commencement of the next period of licensed hours.
- 4. The Licenceholder shall ensure that those persons who deliver the alcohol are aware of the provisions of, and restrictions on, the delivery of alcohol contained in the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005.

I highlighted to the applicant the model local conditions in relation to children and young persons specifically Section 2(a)(ii): -


WHERE ALCOHOL IS SOLD ANCILLARY TO FOOD I.E. RESTAURANTS.

Children and young persons will only be permitted into licensed premises where the primary purpose of allowing them access is to consume a meal. Children and young persons will be permitted in the licensed premises until one hour after the cessation of serving food to the individual person or group of persons consuming the meal.

Upon visiting the premises, the applicant showed me to the disabled toilet where the baby changing facilities are located. As per the mandatory conditions of a premises licence for premises permitting entry to children under the age of 5 the changing facilities are accessible to both males and females.

I do not have any issues with the application and duly submit this report for consideration of Board Members.





The application has been applied for by Whisky and Friends Ltd trading as Whiskydispatch.com and has been applied for as a company with the connected person being noted as being Benjamin Kevin Smith. The proposed premises manager will be Benjamin Kevin Smith who currently holds a personal licence with Angus Council.

I to visit the premises on 17th October 2023 to meet with the proposed Designated Premises Manager, Benjamin Kevin Smith.

I visited the premises on October 2023 and met with the applicant Benjamin Smith. The application is for a premises holding and dispatching alcohol with no public access to the licenced area. The application indicates that delivery of alcohol will be an option and if the board are minded to grant the application, I would suggest that the following delivery conditions be placed on the licence:


The five delivery conditions are as follows:

Comments Received

OBJECTIONS

The Board are advised that there are 3 objections received from members of the public. One objector advised of their wish to remain anonymous. A copy of each objection will be circulated to Board members prior to the meeting.

Licensing Standards Officer - advised he had no comments to make in respect of the application other than to request the Board add the 3 outdoor conditions detailed in his report to the Board.

Building Standards commented: -

The occupancy numbers applied for (public bar 60 and games room 34) exceed our previous records and therefore the number of sanitary facilities provided on the plan are not sufficient for the additional numbers proposed. However, previously accepted numbers of 55 in the Bar and 21 in the games room would be allowable with the current sanitary facilities in place.

Escape route principles for the beer garden area do not comply with the building regulations in terms of various aspects including travel distance, escape route, obstacles, locks, direction of door opening, escape route lighting etc. Building Standards would have concerns at this current time should this area be utilised for the public. It should also be noted that the plans provided do not correlate with the situation on site at this current time.

Environmental Health commented: -

The application is for a new premises licence as the pub has been previously closed and will include, live and recorded musical entertainment within the premises and a beer garden to the rear. This service understands the pub opened last week under an occasional licence and would advise that this service has received a complaint about noise from amplified music being played and Environmental Health are currently investigating this matter.

Given the size of the main bar where musical entertainment is held and the large area of glazing and the glazed entrance doors, this service is concerned that the current building will not easily contain loud noise from amplified music and therefore it is vital that noise levels within the premises are kept low and are adequately controlled by the licensee.


This service would therefore request that a detailed noise management plan be submitted outlining how noise from the premises will be controlled to prevent a public nuisance. The application has been applied for by JJKS Estates LTD and has been applied for as a company with the connected person being noted as being Kevin James Mackie and John William Souttar. The proposed premises manager will be Carla Ogg who currently holds a personal licence with Angus Council.

I visited the premises on 31 October 2023 and met with the proposed Designated Premises Manager, Carla Ogg.

Licensing Standards Officer Report:

The applicants have applied for and been granted occasional licences in relation to this premises and since the granting of the occasional licences and I am aware that one complaint has been received and resolved by Environmental & Consumer Protection.

I note that there has been 3 objections received in relation to this licence application and Board members may wish to ask further questions in relation to these objections.

Building Standards have submitted comments which are noted below, in respect of the application, and the Board may wish to address the Building Standards Officer directly about these.

- The occupancy numbers applied for (public bar 60 and games room 34) exceed our previous records and therefore the number of sanitary facilities provided on the plan are not sufficient for the additional numbers proposed. The three outdoor area conditions are as follows:


