Age

Impact: Negative:

In order to apply the new boundaries part of polling district ESA will need to be split and merged with polling district ESB. This will require a change in polling place for some electors. There is a limited bus service which could negatively impact those young people

who may not be in a financial position to afford their own car and therefore rely on public transport. Similarly, those who are elderly may no longer drive and they may rely on public transport. Both would not be able to access the polling station at a time suitable to them depending on the bus service available.

However, there is a limited bus service and young people voting are entitled to free bus travel if in an area where there is service at no cost to them. Similarly with older people who may have a bus pass.

Free bus travel will mitigate the negative impact for both age groups. Also there is an option to vote by post for all electors who may be impacted by the change.
