DEVELOPER CONTRIBUTIONS AND AFFORDABLE HOUSING SUPPLEMENTARY GUIDANCE 2023

REPORT BY ALISON SMITH, DIRECTOR OF VIBRANT COMMUNITIES AND SUSTAINABLE GROWTH

ABSTRACT

This report details the responses received to the consultation and recommends that Council adopt the Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023. On adoption these will form part of the Angus Local Development Plan (2016).

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Council:

- (i) Notes and gives due regard and consideration to the representations received to the draft Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023, contained within Appendix 1, and agree the Council's response and changes made as a result of the representations.
- (ii) Agree to adopt the Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023, following completion of the relevant procedures.
- (iii) Authorise the Chief Planner/Service Leader of Planning and Sustainable Growth to make any minor technical and typographical changes, as well as, any presentational and graphical changes, to the Supplementary Guidance and to complete all other legislative procedural arrangements associated with the adoption of the Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023

2. ALIGNMENT TO THE COUNCIL PLAN

2.1 This report does not directly contribute to the Angus Council Plan 2023-2028. It will, however, assist with the implementation of the Local Development Plan (2016), which contributes to and fully aligns with the objectives of the Council Plan.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 An update to the Supplementary Guidance was prepared in 2023 to: account for changes required as a result of updated school roll forecasts, to uplift rates in line with indexation, to remove a Sports & Recreation project which will no longer be immediately undertaken, and to make other minor amendments to the text.
- 3.2 At the meeting of the Communities Committee on 15 August 2023 it was agreed to approve the draft Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance and to undertake a six week period of consultation.
- 3.3 As noted in paragraph 3.2 above, the consultation on the draft Supplementary Guidance took place over a period of six weeks, from Friday 1 September to Friday 13 October 2023. The draft Supplementary Guidance was subject to a variety of engagement methods, which included notification to Elected Members, Community Councils, and stakeholders who requested updates on the progress of the Local Development Plan. Details of the proposed draft document were also provided on the Council's website, and in ACCESS offices and libraries. Following the Council's Engagement HQ hub going live on 20 September 2023, all stakeholders were provided with a further opportunity to engage, using the new engagement platform, which was promoted on the Council's social media channels.

3.4 A total of 10 representations were received during the consultation period, all of which were received from external parties; this included 4 key agencies, 2 housebuilders, 2 community councils, 1 architectural firm and an anonymous response.

4. CURRENT POSITION

4.1 Appendix 2 to this report details the responses received, the Council's response to those representations, and any proposed changes that require to be made to the Supplementary Guidance as a result of the representations received.

5. PROPOSALS

- 5.1 With the exception of amendment of the indexation figure for April 2023, no other amendments have been made to the Supplementary Guidance.
- 5.2 Should Council recommend adoption of the Supplementary Guidance; the next stage is the submission of the document to the Scottish Ministers. This submission must be accompanied by a statement setting out how we have undertaken publicity; the comments and representations received; and an explanation of how these comments have been taken into account in the final version of the Supplementary Guidance.
- 5.3 Scottish Ministers then have 28 days in which to approve the adoption of the Supplementary Guidance. As the principle of the policy that the Scottish Government seeks to support has already been established, scrutiny by Scottish Ministers is likely to focus on ensuring that the principles of public engagement and compliance with the Local Development Plan policy on developer contributions and affordable housing.
- 5.4 Once approved by Scottish Ministers, the Supplementary Guidance will form part of the Angus Local Development Plan (2016).

6. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- There are no direct financial implications to the approval and adoption of the Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023. Advertising and other publication costs have been met from existing budgets within the Planning and Sustainable Growth Service.
- The revised Supplementary Guidance will require to undertake a review of existing secured developer contributions to ensure they continue to meet the relevant policy tests. This work will be undertaken as part of the developer obligations monitoring work and will help to inform the preparation of the next Local Development Plan.

7. OTHER IMPLICATIONS

Risks

7.1 The risk to the Council in delay of the adoption and publication of the Supplementary Guidance is a lack of clarity and consistency on the application of policies contained in the Angus Local Development Plan 2016.
