European Barnahus Quality Standards - Bairns' Hoose Standards

The Standards are underpinned by the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC), whilst also aligning with the key policy programmes of Keeping The Promise and Getting it right for every child (GIRFEC), which recognise that all children must receive the right help at the right time. The importance of these Standards is demonstrated by the number of detailed responses to the consultation received nationally and the effort that has been taken to ensure feedback has been taken on board when adapting the European PROMISE Quality Standards to meet the Scottish context.

We will require to measure the impact of the service upon individuals as well as other performance measures - the means to do this will be part of the pilot.

Impact - Positive

The proposed changes will have positive impact providing additional resources to meet the needs of all children in Angus up to the age of 18, who have been victims or witnesses to abuse or violence, as well as children under the age of criminal responsibility whose behaviour has caused significant harm or abuse, will have access to trauma-informed recovery, support, and justice. Consideration is given to the different needs of children at different age and stages of their development.

Disability

Impact - Positive

There will be no discrimination relating to disabilities. The pilot will allow additional resource to be available to engage in a more supported way with children and young people impacted by abuse or violence. As a vulnerable group impacted by Covid restrictions engagement needs to be very individual dependant on individual needs and vulnerabilities of child, young people and adults impacted by disabilities and serious health concerns.

Gender reassignment

Impact- Neutral

The changes will provide holistic support to children who have been victims or witnesses of abuse or are under the age of criminal responsibility whose behaviour may have caused harm and will not discriminate against gender reassignment individuals. All children will be included with no discrimination relating to gender reassignment.

Marriage and Civil Partnership

Impact- Neutral

The Bairn's Hoose model will support children and young people and their families it will not be restricted by adults partnerships status

Pregnancy/Maternity

Impact- Neutral

As noted above the Bairn's Hoose model will support children and young people and their families it will not be restricted by adults situation regarding pregnancy/maternity.

Race - (includes Gypsy Travellers)

Impact- Neutral

All children in Angus with no discrimination on their race including Gypsy Travelers who have been victims or witnesses to abuse or violence, as well as children under the age of criminal responsibility whose behaviour has caused significant harm or abuse, will have access to trauma-informed recovery and support which takes account of their cultural norms.

Religion or Belief

Impact- Neutral

The Bairn's Hoose model will support children and young people and their families it will not be restricted by individuals religion and beliefs.

Sex

Impact- Neutral

The changes will provide holistic support which does not discriminate against a person's sex or sexual orientation. The standards in the model will support a consistent approach where the individual's physical, emotional, and mental wellbeing are supported.

Sexual orientation

Impact- Neutral

The change will not discriminate against the sexual orientation of an individual it will provide holistic support based on the needs of the individual.
