**Area Updates:**

Tannadice

Considerable concern expressed over recent flooding. John Grieve reported the river to have been 0.5 meter higher than the bad floods of 2015 rising to 4.8 metres. Common land has been damaged, water poured down school brae and

the car park was reported to be a mudbath. The village Improvement Group is seeking help to manage some of the flood prevention measures.

Bad flooding also reported at Justinhaugh, where a resident had had to vacate property for 9 months due to flood damage in 2015, and the same thing has happened again.

The gravel in the river has shifted at Justinhaugh creating 4 islands, due to a reported 16 inches of rain in October.

### Finavon

Access to dual carriageway reported as difficult southbound due to a huge hole in the road. It was suggested that Jackie Semple be contacted through the Angus Resilience Forum.

### Glen Prosen

A landslip on the Belmonies section of the road was reported.
