In preparation for a potential decision in favour of re-naming by Angus Council to change the name Cumberland Close, the following questions will require an answer:

- (a) Are there any legal restrictions on changing a street name without obtaining agreement from lease holder(s)?
- (b) Can a re-naming of a street be enforced without the consent of a lease holder?
- (c) There are five commercial units, all occupied, and one residential flat within Cumberland Close. What, if any, percentage of affected premises in opposition to the name change would be required to allow the name Cumberland Close to remain?
- (d) Do the views, opinions and votes of business holders and residents of Cumberland Close carry any more weight than a resident of Kirriemuir who does not work or reside in the afore mentioned street?
- (e) Would Angus Council, on a decision to re-name Cumberland Close, consider waiting until the end of the lease for opposing businesses?
- (f) Would there be any penalties for any opposing businesses ending their lease prematurely, particularly if the business has been adversely affected by the name change?
- (g) What compensation would be available for affected businesses in having to incur unwanted expenses in making the changes required / as part of the re-naming process?

I have attached the printed copy of my completed paper Consultation produced by Angus Council for reference to my objections to a re-naming of Cumberland Close. Please refer to Appendix 1.

It has been pointed out to me by a friend and Kirriemuir resident that in her opinion the online form could be abused by those who wish to have more than their one resident vote by using more than one email address with a postcode. The has emailed her concerns to a councillor of Angus Council. Also, in the same manner, anyone with an email address could use any Kirriemuir postcode even if they were not a resident of Kirriemuir. I tend to agree with finding. To this end, I have tried to re-dress this anomaly by requiring a confirmation 'tick box', both online and on the paper format of our own Survey, to help confirm their residency status.

I noticed particularly online, and several Kirriemuir residents I have spoken with have stated the same, that if a person does not want the name to change then they do not have a choice to suggest another name of their choosing should the re-naming proceed. This indicates a bias towards those who elect change and towards the names suggested.

I felt that a great number of Kirriemuir residents, particularly the elderly, may not have access to Social Media or online websites to learn of or complete such a Consultation. There are also many people, young and old, who do not have access to or purchase newspapers to read about the Consultation, should Angus Council have used the media for the purposes of notification. I felt that some discrimination, albeit possibly inadvertently, has been applied in this instance. I therefore had designed and printed, at the expense of 1,200 Survey Leaflets with details of not just our Survey and how to complete it but with directions to the Angus Council Engage webpage and to the library for the paper Consultation. I had two persons deliver these around some of the Kirriemuir homes and about 200 of these were given out to some organisations.

Angus Council could have been kept low for this project by including the Consultation notification with Council Tax invoices. Regarding the Survey, Appendix 2 consists of an Excel spread sheet summary of the votes received; printed copies of the completed online survey that is sent from website to email address; scanned copies of the original completed paper surveys which have been handed into our premises. All real names have been blanked out for GDPR purposes and to keep the format in line with Angus Council's Consultation. For ease of referencing the votes are as follows: (a) RE-NAME Cumberland Close: 03 (b) KEEP Cumberland Close: 72 (c) VOID / OUTSIDE AREA 16 (d) HISTORY BOARD - YES 31 (e) HISTORY BOARD - NO 16 (f) HISTORY BOARD - MAYBE 19 3. Street Name: Cumberland Close and the 1909 Re-Naming There is no visible evidence within Cumberland Close that refers to Prince William, Duke of Cumberland. The word 'Duke' does not appear anywhere on the signage relating to Cumberland has not evidenced that it is named after Prince William, Duke of Cumberland and has admitted to his assumption being so in his covering letter in Appendix 4 [pg 1]: "I believe his [Mr John Gordon] motivation to change the name to Cumberland Close was, to honour the memory of Butcher Cumberland and remind the townsfolk of his presence in Kirriemuir." Mr Gordon died in December 1925, in Leeds, and therefore cannot speak for himself. Unless written proof can be found there is very little chance that after 100 years any of Mr Gordon's family members will be able to provide this evidence. Without evidence it is hearsay or assumption. In the book Kirriemuir Its Streets And Place Names by D.G. Orr [pg 6] it is written "It is a source of pride that Kirriemarians have always regarded the old names as part of their heritage ..." According to many of the comments received in my Survey it would appear to remain true that Kirriemarians do regard Cumberland Close as part of their heritage. Many respondents have stated that history, good or bad, should not be changed but rather explained for all to learn from. Many have implied that they would like to have a history board in Cumberland Close. These comments can be read in the redacted Survey forms in Appendix 2. 4. Angus Council Minutes of Meeting (14/12/2023, Report No 351/23 and Report No 277/33 The Minutes of Angus Council's Meeting on 14th December 2023 state: "... officers were unable to verify the accuracy of the information contained in the petition or the veracity of any of the allegations made." It may transpire that as to seek legal advice in the legality / process of changing address and whether or not a delay can be made should Angus Council decide to proceed with any name change immediately post-decision.

The costs for Angus Council I would expect to likely far exceed that of having a new street sign made and fitted, even if an anonymous benefactor is willing to provide for the signage. Taking account of my own very small Company's likely costs, I would expect Angus Council's expenditure on this project would more than likely far exceed particularly as Angus Council would have to pay wages and salaries for staff involved in the process.

The Angus Council Plan 2023-2028, Delivering Services for People [pg 3] states "... currently estimates that a further £70m over the next five-year period will have to be saved over the lifetime of this Council Plan, with around £52m of that over the next three years. This cannot be achieved by continually cutting services. Rather, the Council must find radical, wide ranging, and innovative ways of tackling rising costs and reducing budgets, while supporting those most vulnerable in our community." In the interest of transparency and compliance with legislation and/or Council Policies, questions arise regarding the appropriateness of pursuing the re-naming of Cumberland Close, including the potential financial costs to Angus Council and the donation proposed from an anonymous benefactor:

- (a) How does the proposed re-naming of Cumberland Close fit into this (quoted above) budgeting plan?
- (b) Does Angus Council know the source where this money is coming from and undertaken appropriate money laundering assessments?
- (c) In the interest of transparency, has Angus Council enquired of any personal links to any executives, officers, councillors, staff?
- (d) Is the anonymous benefactor employed or contracted or connected to Angus Council?

- (e) Would there be any other possible conflict of interest between the benefactor and beneficiary whereby it may be conceived to be a bribe?
- (f) If there is no conflict of interest does Angus Council have a written agreement with the Benefactor and what guarantee is there that it will be paid?
- (g) Is the Benefactor's donation to be held in a Client Account until required?

Angus Council, in Agenda Item No. 6, Report No. 351/23, indicates a possibility that the "...costs could be met from the Common Good Fund of Kirriemuir and Dean." In what way would this benefit a substantial proportion of the inhabitants of Kirriemuir when the majority of residents do not reside, walk into or through Cumberland Close?

REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF LEGAL, GOVERNANCE AND CHANGE

ABSTRACT

This Report provides details of a petition submitted to the Director of Legal, Governance and Change in connection with the re-naming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF and the subsequent decision of the Scrutiny & Audit Committee to refer the matter to Council for debate.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that the Council: -

- (i) notes the decision of the Scrutiny & Audit Committee on 26 October 2023 to refer the matter to Council for debate and agrees one of the recommendations detailed at (ii)-(v) below;
- (ii) notes receipt of the petition and takes no further action;
- (iii) determines that appropriate action has already been taken or is planned and no further action is necessary;
- (iv) requests a fuller report from the relevant officer; or
- (v) undertakes a detailed scrutiny review gathers evidence, and makes recommendations to a future meeting of the Council.

2. ALIGNMENT TO THE COUNCIL PLAN

This Report contributes to the achievement of our priority that the council is efficient and effective as detailed in our Council Plan for 2023 – 2028.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 On 17 August 2023 a petition signed by 956 people which included 629 signatories from outwith the Angus area, was lodged with Angus Council. In order for the petition to be put before the Scrutiny and Audit committee, there required to be more than 50 signatories from within the Angus area. This requirement was satisfied. Members noted that Standing Order 14 which detailed the requirements in terms of any petition received, provided that petitions would only be accepted where the name and address had been provided with all signatories requiring to be resident in Angus. More recently with the advent of e-petitions, the Scrutiny and Audit committee had accepted petitions when only postal codes of signatories were provided particularly in light of data protection considerations. All signatories within the Angus area had provided a postal code and there were 327 signatories from Angus.
- 3.2 This petition was reported to the Scrutiny & Audit Committee on 26 October 2023 (Report No 277/23) in accordance with Standing Order 14.
- 3.3 The Scrutiny & Audit Committee agreed to refer the matter to Council for debate without any discussion taking place on the detail of the matter.

4. CURRENT POSITION

4.1 The Petition is headed "Renaming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF" and seeks permission to re-name Cumberland Close, Visocchi's Close. A copy of the covering letter submitted with the petition along with details of its rationale which was also submitted with the

petition are attached as Appendix 1 to this report. Also included is background information submitted with the petition.

- 4.2 Officers of the Council requested Angus Archives carry out some background research into this matter and their findings are detailed in Appendix 2 of this report. Beyond this detail provided by Angus Archives, officers are unable to verify the accuracy of the information contained in the petition or the veracity of any of the allegations made. If elected members wished to have further background detail regarding these matters officers would be obliged to pay to instruct an appropriate specialist historian.
- 4.3 Members may also wish to be aware that there is a contrary petition on the matter headed "Save our history Don't change our street names". The contrary petition currently has 86 signatories and has not been submitted to the Council.
- 4.4 Members are asked to give consideration to this matter and determine what to do and the Council may agree one of the options as detailed in Standing Order 14 and as set out in the recommendations to this report.
- 4.5 Information on naming of new streets is available on the Council's web site. https://www.angus.gov.uk/roads_parking_and_travel/roads_and_pavements/street_naming_a_nd_house_numbering/naming_new_streets#:~:text=Local%20councillors%20decide%20on%20new,and%20the%20local%20delivery%20office
- The process for re-naming a street or close would include officers preparing a site plan showing the affected addresses, updating of our own address gazetteer, contacting the Royal Mail and lettering all interested parties including emergency services and public utility providers. There are 6 separate addresses in Cumberland Close, five of which are dedicated to commercial units owned by the council. Currently, three businesses are operating within Cumberland Close, with plans for an additional business to occupy another commercial unit in the near future. Any renaming of the close will have an impact in different ways on current owners and occupiers. In terms of any decision of the council, it is advised that a rationale is provided for the decision.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications per se in terms of this report, specifically other than officers' time spent looking into matters to date. There may be additional financial implications depending on what Council decides to do with the petition. In particular, if members wish to instruct a specialist historian that will incur costs for which no specific budget provision exists. If members decide to recommend a change in the name of the Close that will incur costs (estimated at approx. £500) in providing the required new signage. There would also be the requirement for further officer time to carry out the process of re-naming the street/close as well as potentially dealing with any enquiries.

It is noted that it is detailed in the petition that the costs could be met from the Common Good Fund of Kirriemuir and Dean. This would require that the expenditure benefit the inhabitants of the Burgh of Kirriemuir. Although the Common Good policy guidelines do not define what "benefit the inhabitants" means, custom and practice is to consider that Common Good funding would only be appropriate where the spend would benefit a significant or substantial proportion of the Burgh. Local Kirriemuir members would be consulted on their views prior to any report going to committee.

6. EQUALITY IMPLICATIONS

In what way would this benefit a substantial proportion of the inhabitants of Kirriemuir when the majority of residents do not reside, walk into or through Cumberland Close.

There are no direct equality implications in terms of this report as its recommendations have no differential impact on those with protected characteristics.

The Visocchi family brought joy, employment and happiness to the town and it would be fitting to remember them for their significant contribution to Kirriemuir over many years. 

These twenty name reversions were to satisfy Angus Council's requests to purchase the Roods property or part thereof to accommodate pathways. Negotiations between Angus Council and Mr Gordon resulted in a compromise of part of the house being given up for Angus Council's alterations and in exchange Mr Gordon was allowed to change the 1909 names back to their historical or previous names.

With the Royal troops desirably stirred up for the occasion, Cumberland's plan for victory was falling in to place. On this fateful day, he and his men would commit large scale atrocities on and off the battlefield, killing and wounding not only the Jacobite forces but also those who retreated, as well as innocent bystanders.

The bloodthirsty campaign to finish the Jacobites did not end on the battlefield. Whilst securing his victory, Cumberland gave orders from his headquarters, sending out several contingents of troops, backed by the Royal Navy.

The instructions were to effectively wipe-out and destroy any semblance of life in the Highlands, in what could be described as a genocide of sorts, played out by Royal soldiers setting alight to homes, murdering, imprisoning and raping as they meticulously carried out their instructions.



Sandy Whitecross, a native, who became an ardeut apostle and intimate friend of the reformer John Knox, quartered here on his arrival. Afterwards he was stoned to death by the Popish mob whom he endeavoured to convert to the faith he had espoused in 1649.

It was also graced (?) by the presence of the Duke of Cumberland while on his butchering career here during the Rebellion of 1745.

A good deal of the switch-back sensation is experienced while doing Thrums. "The Tnowe-heid" is down and then up, by way of the Tannage Brae—the house of Jamie Donaldson, "Kirrie's oracle."

St. Malcoln's Wynd (Airlie Street) leads on to Back Wynd (Reform Street). The Manse Close is allied to the past by its connection with the ingenious David Sands. He was so skilful a weaver that he wove three shirts without a seam. He completely finished them in the loom, with buttons, button-holes, hemming and stitching, also putting ruffles on them. One was sent to the King—Charles L, another to the Duke of Athol, and the third to the Society for Encouraging Arts and Manufactures. The whole benefit he reaped was £5. He also wove cloth for staymakers, double and stitched, thus saving every part of their labour, except shaping and putting in the whale-bone.

In 1798 a Company of Volunteers was raised here, which was commanded by Captain James Sands (James, great grandson to David), with Messrs Douglas and Couper as Lieutenants. When the Duke of Portland's letter was read to the men by their Captain they answered the request it contained with three cheers, and an offer of their services to any part of Great Britain, or wheresoever their officers would lead them!



In old days this entire western section of the town was a nest of small public-houses, workshops, and brew-seau with their attendant kilns, some of which are remembered by their names in certain portions of the locality. Millar's Lane, a title borrowed as in many other cases from an owner or prominent occupier, was known of old as Burial Wynd. Funerals from the west approached the Parish Churchyard by this narrow avenue, and many a funeral party forgot their woes within its old Gairie Inn when their mounful duties were over. This ancient hostelry is still in use as business premises, and is well worthy of attention. There is a tradition, of some repute, that when the Duke of Cumberland was scouring the glens for rebels, after Cuiloden, he slept one night within its humble walls. It is one of the




Fireplace Lintel, Old Gairse inn.



It is a source of pride that Kirriemarians have always regarded the old names as part of their heritage and it is in that spirit that we seek to record many of the old names and attempt to explain the origins of some of the more recent ones as well.

We are not the first to be concerned with the recording of the names.

It is interesting to note from an article re-published in the 'Kirriemuir Observer' on 2 January 1925, that the Street Names of the town of Kirrie were "painted on glass" way back in 1866.

BACK TO THE OLD NAME

Then in September 1909, the Town Council received a suggestion from Mr John Gordon, ex Mayor of Leeds, but a native born on 12 November 1854 in Kirriemuir, to revert to the old names of the streets in Kirriemuir, and should they agree to this, he would defray all expenses connected therewith.

The Town Council accepted the offer and the changes made were as follows: -

Background Research from Angus Archives

Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir

Taken from the Kirriemuir Town Council minute book K/1/1/13 and K/1/1/14.

Summary of findings:

- The above street seems to have taken its many names from the proprietor of the first house/business in the close. It was Lindsay's Close from at least 1855 to 1885 when the Lindsay's owned the first property in the close. The Lindsay's sold the property and it was eventually bought by Mrs Mary Millar. Mrs Millar kept the original name at this point but then renamed the street.
- It became Millar's Lane sometime between 1886 and 1895 when Mrs Mary Millar owned the first house.
- It is possible that, due to the constant change of name, Kirriemuir Town Council and Mr Gordon, made the proprietor at the time, decided to change the name to a more permanent one, when they replaced the name plates.

Decision iointly?

Mr Gordon owned the first property on Miller's Lane / Cumberland Close:

After reading the minutes of the Kirriemuir Town Council I can determine that:

Q2: When did Mr Gordon acquire the property?

On 11th February 1909, Kirriemuir started a programme of retarring roads and laying pavements throughout the town.

On 11th March 1909, a report on the state of the Kirk Wynd mentioned:

"the street is a public one and is frequently used for through vehicular traffic....... there is a very narrow part where the dyke of Gairie House [later the Gairie Inn] juts out on the roadway where it will scarcely be possible to have pavements, but there are no entrances at this part, and in time it may be possible to get the street widened at this particular part....."

23rd July 1909:

"I am quite sure, that, treated as a separate matter, the Council will gladly accept your offer of a part of the jutting out property in the Roods, for the improvement of the roadway and they will also as a separate matter take into consideration, your proposal anent reverting to the old names of some of the streets, if you will give me a list of the changes which you propose. I think you are under some misapprehension in regard to the Bailie Street property. The Council have never served any Requisition for the laying of pavement or kerb there, and so far, as I know, they have no intention of doing so. At the same time, they cannot bind their Successors in Office in regard to this matter, and I am sure you would not expect them to try it. Yours faithfully Archd. Smith."

19th July 1909:

Mr John Gordon and Mr Archibald smith trade letters which are written into the minutes in which they discussed the renaming of roads in Kirriemuir.

Q3: Am I able to obtain a copy or to see the minutes or these letters?

John Gordon states:

"I should like it to be quite clear that I am not offering to give the town any part of the property that justs out into the Roods. My recollection is that some years ago we were asked to sell it to the town. No money consideration would induce me to part with it.

The negotiations for Angus Council acquiring some or all of the Roods property appears to have begun a few

Q4: When did Angus Council first approach Mr Gordon years prior to this negotiation.

Q5: Who suggested that Mr Gordon should be allowed to select new names for the towns streets as part of the deal?

This appears that Angus Council agreed, through negotiation, to Mr Gordon's requests in order for them to secure enough ground to lay pavements

But if the Council will revert to the old street names, which is a point on which I have a strong sentiment and will supply free water:

It appears to be taken from a longer sentence and/or paragraph.

Q6: What does "Way leave" mean and in what context is this phrase used?

I will give part of the house in the Roods, & I will pay for the new street name plates. From this you will gather that the question of the old street names should be decided first. All that the Council has to do is say they assent. The other points of Way leave; giving part of a house; and paying for new name plates, will then be borne by me as a matter of course."

9th September 1909:

"There was a letter approving the three additional alterations proposed by the Council, in renaming certain streets. The Council therefore unanimously resolved in virtue and in terms of Section 144 of the Burgh Police (Scotland) Act 1892 to alter the names of certain streets in the Burghand revert to old names as follows:

- 1. Roods instead of Roods Street
- 2. Tillyloss instead of Newton Banks
- 3. School Wynd instead of James Street
- 4. Marywell Brae instead of Marywell Street
- 5. Bellies Brae instead of Bailie Street
- 6. Tannage Brae instead of Bridge Street
- 7. Glengate instead of Glengate Street
- 8. Seceders Close instead of Kirk Close
- 9. St. Malcom's Wynd instead of Airlie Street
- 10. Croft Head instead of Croft Terrace

9th December 1909:

There was read Mr Gordon's letter of 21st October last in which he made suggestions in regard to a number of street names which might in his view be changed to the old names in addition to those already dealt with and asked the Council to consider his suggestions. After consideration the Committee agreed to recommend to the Council as follows:

- 1. Gordon Park for Park Street
- 2. Pierhead for Kilnburn Place
- 3. Rogers Close for Rogers Lane
- 4. Bank Close for Bank Lane
- 5. Ogilvy's Close for Ogilvy's Lane
- 6. Lilybank for Lilybank Road
- 7. Wellbank for Wellbank Terrace
- 8. Craig's Close for Craig's Lane
- 9. St. Mary's Close for St. May's Lane
- 10. Cumberland Close for Millar's Lane

First names mentioned are the older names; second names are what they were known as in 1909.

Therefore it would seem Cumberland Close was named as such prior to it being Miller's Lane.

The clerk was asked to write to Mr Gordon to see if this would meet with his approval.

After much back and forth with Mr Gordon, the Council went ahead and ordered the new name plates for the above 20 properties on 14 July 1910.

"The Committee further recommended that the name plates for the streets as renamed be procured and put up as formerly resolved upon by the Council."

PROVOST BOYD, in the Chair.

The Provost advised that members had been provided with an Addendum to Report No 359/23 which referenced amendments to paragraph 5.1 of the Report summarising the changes made to the Supplementary Guidance following the consultation and now included reference to other changes that were made. The Addendum had not been published within the required "3 clear days" by reason of special circumstance however, the Provost had determined that in accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 11(1)(vii) the item could be considered at this meeting as a matter of urgency as the amendments required to be taken into consideration to allow members to consider the Report prior to adoption of the policy.

Thereafter, the Provost paid tribute to Mrs Margo Williamson who was retiring from her position of Chief Executive with Angus Council. Mrs Williamson had worked in local government for over 40 years, the past 10 with Angus Council. The Provost, on behalf of the Council, wished Margo a long, happy and healthy retirement.

1. APOLOGIES

Apologies for absence were intimated on behalf of Councillors David Fairweather and Ross Greig.

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST AND STATEMENTS OF TRANSPARENCY

Councillor Bell made a statement of transparency in relation to Item 7 Report No 315/23 as the person who organised the petition was a constituent and friend. Councillor Bell advised that she had not signed the petition and indicated that she would take part in any discussion and voting.

Sarah Forsyth, Committee Officer declared an interest in item 7 Report No 315/23 as she had a family connection to the petitioner. She indicated that she would leave the meeting during consideration of the item and Fiona Anderson, Committee Officer would clerk the meeting for that item.

3. REQUEST FOR DEPUTATIONS

The Provost intimated that a request for a deputation had been received from Mr Scott McFarlane, the petitioner in relation to Report No 315/23 — Petition — Renaming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir. The Council resolved to receive the deputation from Mr McFarlane.

The Provost intimated that a request for a deputation had been received from Ms Annie McLean, Business Owner trading from Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir in relation to Report No 315/23 – Petition – Renaming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir. The Council resolved to receive the deputation from Ms McLean.

The Provost intimated that a request for a deputation had also been received from Ms Hannah Matthew on behalf of Guild Homes in relation to Report No 359/23 — Developer Contributions and Affordable Housing Supplementary Guidance 2023. The Council resolved to receive the deputation from Ms Matthew.

The Council resolved to approve the motion.

Having declared an interest at Article 2 above, Sarah Forsyth, Committee Officer, left the meeting prior to the deputations and consideration of the following item.

Deputation

Mr Scott McFarlane addressed the meeting and provided background information on his involvement with the petition headed "Renaming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF" which sought permission to re-name Cumberland Close, Visocchi's Close. He advised that his online petition had gathered 956 signatures and had been submitted to the Director of Legal, Governance and Change on 17 August 2023 demanding a name change to Cumberland Close. He had also submitted a covering letter with the petition giving details of its rationale and included background information.

He advised members that Cumberland Close took its name from Augustus, Duke of Cumberland and that he had been sent to crush the Jacobite uprising as England's leading general of the era. He had reportedly stayed in Kirriemuir during the 18th century military campaign and Mr McFarlane banded him a "disgrace of a man" as he claimed that he had been responsible for many murders and rapes and was also a torturer.

He advised members that he had received further information backing up his claims from Professor Murray Pittock, Vice Principal, Glasgow University and read out the contents of an email received from him.

He also informed members that he had received the sum of £500 from an anonymous doner towards the cost of new signage should the Council agree to a name change for Cumberland Close.

Following a number of questions from members to Mr McFarlane, the Provost thanked Mr McFarlane for his presentation.

Deputation

Ms Anne McLean addressed the meeting and advised members that she was a business owner who operated from Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir and urged members to "let history inform the future". She spoke of the costly practical considerations that her small Art business may have to endure should this name change take place as she would require to change all her signage, stationery, some goods etc. She would also have to inform customers, HMRC and her bank of the address change should the re-naming of the Close take place.

Ms McLean suggested that she would not be opposed to an information board being erected within Cumberland Close advising of the history behind the naming of the Close as she felt that history should not be erased and should be learned from.

Following a number of questions from members to Ms McLean, the Provost thanked Ms McLean for her presentation.

7. PETITION - RENAMING OF CUMBERLAND CLOSE, KIRRIEMUIR

With reference Article 5 of the minute of meeting of the Scrutiny and Audit Committee of 26 October 2023, there was submitted Report No 315/23 by the Director of Legal, Governance and Change providing details of a petition submitted in connection with the re-naming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF and the subsequent decision of the Scrutiny & Audit Committee to refer the matter to Council for debate.

The Petition sought permission to re-name Cumberland Close, Visocchi's Close, and a copy of the covering letter submitted with the petition along with details of its rationale which was also submitted with the petition were attached as Appendix 1 to the Report. Background information was also submitted with the petition.

The Report indicated that officers of the Council had requested that Angus Archives carry out some background research into this matter and their findings were detailed in Appendix 2 of the Report. Beyond this detail provided by Angus Archives, officers were unable to verify the accuracy of the information contained in the petition or the veracity of any of the allegations

made. Members were also advised that there was a contrary petition on the matter headed "Save our history - Don't change our street names". The contrary petition currently had 86 signatories and had not been submitted to the Council.

At this point in the meeting, Councillor Whiteside seconded by Councillor Meechan gave notice of an amendment, a copy of which was circulated to all members.

The Council resolved to adjourn for a 10 minute period to allow members to consider the contents of the amendment.

The meeting resumed at 3.04pm.

Discussion then took place during which a number of members expressed their views on the matter.

Councillor Proctor, seconded by Councillor Fotheringham, moved that the Council resolves to note receipt of the petition and takes no further action.

COUNCILLOR WHITESIDE, SECONDED BY COUNCILLOR MEECHAN, MOVED AS AN AMENDMENT, THAT THE COUNCIL RESOLVES: -

- (I) TO NOTE THE DETAIL OF THE PETITION TO CHANGE THE NAME OF CUMBERLAND CLOSE AND THE DETAIL IN THE COUNCIL REPORT;
- (II) TO NOTE THE STRENGTH OF FEELING IN KIRRIEMUIR AROUND THE ISSUE;
- (III) TO AGREE THAT THE RESIDENTS OF KIRRIEMUIR SHOULD MAKE THE DECISION AROUND ANY CHANGE OF NAME;
- (IV) TO AGREE IN PRINCIPLE TO CONSIDER A CHANGE OF NAME; AND
- (V) TO INSTRUCT THE DIRECTOR OF INFRASTRUCTURE AND ENVIRONMENT TO CARRY OUT A CONSULTATION FOR THE RESIDENTS OF KIRRIEMUIR TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO CHANGE THE NAME OF CUMBERLAND CLOSE, AND IF SO, WHETHER THIS SHOULD BE TO (I) VISOCCHI CLOSE, (II) LINDSAY CLOSE, (III) MILLAR LANE OR (IV) SOME OTHER NAME AND THEREAFTER, TO COLLATE THE RESPONSES AND BRING BACK A REPORT TO COUNCIL ON THE OUTCOME OF THAT CONSULTATION.

REPORT BY DIRECTOR OF LEGAL, GOVERNANCE AND CHANGE

ABSTRACT

This Report advises members of a petition which was received in connection with the re-naming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF.

1. RECOMMENDATIONS

In terms of Standing Order 14, the Committee may EITHER:

- (i) note receipt of the petition and take no further action:
- (ii) determine that appropriate action has already been taken or is planned and no further action is necessary;
- (iii) request a fuller report from the relevant officer;
- (iv) undertake a detailed scrutiny review, gather evidence, and make recommendations to the relevant committee; or
- (v) refer the matter to Angus Council where in the view of the Committee, its significance requires a debate.

2. ALIGNMENT TO THE COUNCIL PLAN

This Report contributes to the achievement of our priority that the council is efficient and effective as detailed in our Council Plan for 2023 – 2028.

3. CURRENT POSITION

3.1 On 17 August 2023 a petition signed by 956 people which included 629 signatories from outwith the Angus area, was lodged with Angus Council. In order for the petition to be put before this committee, there requires to be more than 50 signatories from within the Angus area. This requirement is satisfied. Members should note that Standing Order 14 which details the requirements in terms of any petition received, provides that petitions will only be accepted where the name and address has been provided with all signatories requiring to be resident in Angus. More recently with the advent of e-petitions, the Committee has accepted petitions when only postal codes of signatories are provided particularly in light of data protection considerations. All signatories within the Angus area have provided a postal code and there are 327 signatories from Angus.

How many signatories from Kirriemuir? How many from Cumberland Close residents / businesses?

The petition was acknowledged on receipt.

As the agenda and papers for the meeting of the Scrutiny and Audit Committee on 22 August 2023 had already been published, this is the first opportunity for the matter to be considered by this Committee in terms of the procedure set out in Standing Order 14.

The Petition is headed "Renaming of Cumberland Close, Kirriemuir DD8 4EF" and seeks permission to re-name Cumberland Close, Visoccohi's Close. A copy of the covering letter submitted with the petition along with details of its rationale which was also submitted with the petition are attached as Appendix 1 to this report. Also included is background information submitted with the petition.

Officers of the Council requested Angus Archives carry out some background research into this matter and their findings are detailed in Appendix 2 of this report. Beyond this detail provided

by Angus Archives, officers are unable to verify the accuracy of the information contained in the petition or the veracity of any of the allegations made. If elected members wished to have further background detail regarding these matters officers would be obliged to pay to instruct an appropriate specialist historian.

Members may also wish to be aware that there is a contrary petition on the matter headed "Save our history - Don't change our street names". The contrary petition currently has 86 signatories and has not been submitted to the Council.

Members are asked to give consideration to this matter and determine what to do. Committee may agree one of the options as detailed in Standing Order 14 above. Members should be aware that Standing Order 40(5) provides that in the interests of efficiency whenever possible business should only be presented to one committee being the committee whose order of reference includes the principal issues to be considered. On that basis, the Scrutiny and Audit Committee could determine to refer this matter to the Communities Committee with a fuller report from officers on the matter. This is because under the terms of reference of the Communities Committee, the Communities Committee is responsible for the functions of the Council in relation to street names and property numbers.

What is the 'Rationale"

The process for re-naming a street or close would include officers preparing a site plan showing the affected addresses, updating of our own address gazetteer, contacting the Royal Mail and TWO UNITS lettering all interested parties including emergency services and public utility providers. There are 6 separate addresses in Cumberland Close, five of which are dedicated to commercial units owned by the council. Currently, three businesses are operating within Cumberland Close, with plans for an additional business to occupy another commercial unit in the near future. Any renaming of the close will have an impact in different ways on current owners and occupiers. In terms of any decision of the council, it is advised that a rationale is provided for the decision.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Cost analysis required? There are no financial implications per se in terms of this report, specifically other than officers' time spent looking into matters to date. There may be additional financial implications depending on what the Committee decides to do with the petition. In particular, if members wish to instruct a specialist historian that will incur costs for which no specific budget provision exists. If members decide to recommend a change in the name of the Close that will incur costs (estimated at approx. £500) in providing the required new signage. There would also be the requirement for further officer time to carry out the process of re-naming the street/close.

It is noted that it is detailed in the petition that the costs could be met from the Common Good Fund of Kirriemuir and Dean. This would require that the expenditure benefit the inhabitants of the Burgh of Kirriemuir. Although the Common Good policy guidelines do not define what "benefit the inhabitants" means, custom and practice is to consider that Common Good funding would only be appropriate where the spend would benefit a significant or substantial proportion of the Burgh, Local Kirriemuir members would be consulted on their views prior to any report going to committee.

Message from the Leader of Angus Council and the Chief Executive

The Angus Council Plan sets out the council's vision, priorities and overarching strategic policy framework for the next five years. This new plan comes at a time when local government in Scotland faces financial challenges on a scale never seen before.

The Council has already saved £78.1m from its core budget over the last 10 years and currently estimates that a further £70m over the next five-year period will have to be saved over the lifetime of this Council Plan, with around £52m of that over the next three years. This cannot be achieved by continually cutting services. Rather, the Council must find radical, wideranging, and innovative ways of tackling rising costs and reducing budgets, while supporting those most vulnerable in our community.

This Council Plan provides renewed focus and commitment to work even more closely and effectively with all partners, stakeholders, and communities, with the council being a catalyst, rather than the sole provider of some services. This will allow the council to protect and adequately resource the core services it is legally required to deliver. These include schools, support and protection of vulnerable people, roads, and waste services alongside the important provision of housing, although these too face change.

Over the past 12 months the council has faced a wide range of additional challenges from the COVID pandemic, storms, floods and now the Cost-of-Living crisis. Recovery from these is best achieved when the affected community can exercise a high degree of self-determination and contribute to the process. Therefore, there are clear links in this council plan to the new Angus Community Plan which is the partnership response to local needs and outlines the approach and collaborative activity to support our economy, people and place.

ROMANTIC CLOUD OF PASSION

Passion, strong passion that stirs deep within a person, can cloud all reason and understanding. Bias raises its ugly and distorting head when passion takes hold of us. This is true of both roused passion in the heat of the moment or whether it is through a long passage of time that has allowed us to romanticise and build an often false image of events, actions or recordings. We just have to look at how Prince Charles Edward Stuart and The Duke of Cumberland are remembered: the former as Bonnie Prince Charlie (of the shortbread tins that flood our tourist retailers today) and the latter as The Butcher (an etching created a few months after the Battle of Culloden and can be seen in many book illustrations). The Prince is more romantically remembered than the Duke and our passions usually rise in favour of the Prince whilst condemning the Duke in perpetuity. Passion is also constructed through our own life experiences and psychological processing of the facts we are encountering as we research or reach through history to reveal what we want to hear as our truth.

Facts cannot lie. Or can they? Facts gathered immediately during or after an event will always ring truest but even with such a close and timely recording the facts can be distorted by the registrar's own bias or cloud of passion. Given a few hours or days and little anomalies can creep in. Ask any policeman when the best time to get a victim or witness statement is. Give several months or years and threads of the original facts can become tangled and remembered wrongly or out of sequence. When centuries pass it is even more difficult to keep the facts as close to the actual event as possible when we are hearing or reading not just second hand recordings but third, fourth and many more through the generations that follow. This is how facts get, albeit unintentionally, distorted and removed from the real truth.

One of the United Kingdom's most brutal and bloody battles was our last Civil War in the eighteenth century: the Battle of Culloden in 1746 fought on Scottish Highland soil. There has been much written and re-told about this short but ferocious battle. In less than an hour, some references say around 40 minutes of battle, there were "Around 1,250 Jacobites were dead, a similar number wounded, and 376 prisoners taken. By contrast the Government forces suffered only around 50 fatalities with less than 300 wounded." [pg. 55, National Trust for Scotland, 2022]. According to the National Trust [pg. 60, ibid], and the many other reference materials available, the Duke of Cumberland was ruthless towards the Jacobites. His orders to his troops were to give 'No Quarter'; in other words to show no mercy to the enemy as, allegedly, one of the Jacobite Commanders, Lord George Murray, had given the order to give 'No Quarter' should the Jacobites be the victors. Historical records have proved this to be untrue. The National Trust for Scotland also states in this same book that "In accordance with contemporary practice, he (Cumberland) viewed the Jacobites as traitors and rebels outside the conventions of international combat. However the French contingent, the Royal Ecossais, and the Irish were to be spared as prisoners of war." [pg. 60, ibid] Some on the government side refused the "invitation to kill, a few turned a blind eye, others preferred plunder to violence Some of the most shocking incidents after the battle tell of the brutality of Scot on Scot, of Lowlander on Highlander and between rival clans." [pg. 60, ibid].

The National Trust for Scotland have proved themselves to be good archivists in their efforts to collect, preserve, display and re-tell the events as close to the factual truth as possible. My most recent visit to the National Trust for Scotland's site at Culloden [15-16th April, 2024] has shown me that a balanced view without any visible bias is being presented to the general public, many of whom have travelled from several different countries. None the less, I have sought to verify their rendition of facts as they have presented them, both the Government and Jacobite perspectives, and used several other books of reference in the process. I will refer to these other sources in later Blogs, as I have done in earlier writings.

One of the misnomers that has risen throughout the passage of time is that this battle was one between the English and the Scottish, with the victors being the English. This is certainly not true. It was a battle between the Government and Civilians. It was the last Civil War fought on our land. This battle was the struggle to gain control both in a political and religious sense. Both the Prince and the Duke were fighting for political and religious reasons, but primarily they were fighting for their family sovereignty. The aftermath that followed this battle shows how unjust and cruel not just one person but a whole society can be when they attempt to tear each other apart in the warped and distorted passions held within political or religious zealots.

Coming back to the passions of today, I neither wish to be dismissive or be in denial of the dreadful events during this whole episode of our last Civil War. It is *OUR* war; *OUR* history; *OUR* inheritance which needs to be archived and available for all future generations to know about and understand the events from a mid-eighteenth century perspective. It is not an easy one to be comfortable with but neither the Prince nor the Duke should be romanticised nor degenerated for what was most possibly the biggest and bloodiest undertakings they felt obliged to do in order to preserve their family sovereignty, their political leanings and their religious faiths. If we allow our passions to cloud over with our own bias or judgements then we are no better than 18th century warmongers living in the past; we will remain fighting for politics and religion instead of for all humanity.
