	 Recorded Crime: Recorded crime in the area remains low. Speeding: Speeding enforcement took place in Newbigging on Easter Sunday. 		
	 The following was additionally raised and discussed in meeting: Dirt Bike: Reports of a dirt bike rider going around village on a black bike, Panmure road, round park, Monikie Hall, if anyone knows who this person is and/or local can you please get in contact with the community police team direct. Monikie Park/Granary Wynd: The police remain vigilant around Monikie Park and have been following up on reported incidents around park and Granary Wynd. Nighttime patrols remain in place within the park. Contact: Any concerns please contact the Community Police Team direct (details below and personal emails on the useful links at end of document).

8 A.O.C.B. 8.1 Parking/Waiting Restrictions (Angus Council) ANGUS COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING) (ON-STREET PARKING) (DECRIMINALISED ENFORCEMENT) (No. 7) ORDER 202X The Notice of Proposals in respect of this Order was published in The Courier and Advertiser on Friday, 18 April 2025 and objections to, or comments about the Order require to be lodged in writing or by email to Roads@angus.gov.uk by Friday, 16 May 2025. Angus Council propose to introduce various new waiting restrictions and remove unnecessary restrictions on the lengths of roads listed below and as shown on the associated plans. Police Scotland, elected members, residents and other members of the public have raised concerns over matters arising from inappropriate kerbside parking of vehicles. These include restricted drivers' visibility at junctions, restricted access to premises, general congestion, and congestion at or near school entrances. The various requests or suggestions have been assessed by Roads officers in consultation with Police Scotland and in terms of the locations it is considered that the introduction of waiting restrictions is appropriate for the reasons given and in the interest of pedestrian and traffic safety. Introducing 'No waiting at any time' restrictions to improve visibility and prevent obstructions at the following junctions: Market Pend/Panmure Road, Monikie Introducing 'No waiting at any time' restrictions to relieve congestion and maintain general access and free traffic flow in the following roads: - Panmure Road, Monikie Legend No waiting at anytime No Waiting Between Mon-Sat 8:30 - 5:30 (Prospective) Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft Order which, together with the associated plans and other accompanying documents is available at <u>www.angus.gov.uk/trafficorders</u> A resident advised that the service strip (not part of the public highway), own or adopted footpaths. If own service strip, considered private property. What basis or reasoning was this property affected, water and electrical pole, services they have the write to us re repairs. (Unadopted path). They advised that their business will be impinged by this restrictions, the

business operates out of this area. Why are there not parking restrictions in other areas. Straight long road and same side links, think we are being victimised. Residents previously reported, might be put off by aesthetics of area.



Public Notice – resident been advised this is from resident complaints. Cllr McDonald to take the issue forward for resident on what was discussed re deeds etc.

Assumption that it's the local residents that have complained, no other representative to comment and this was purely based on the resident's assumption re the access/egress of Market Pend and also Panmure Road.
