
We want you to...


- 1. **Co-produce** the engagement activities by working in partnership with us.
- 2. **Guarantee** our involvement is **voluntary** and the **topic is relevant** to those involved.
- 3. Provide safe spaces at suitable times in agreement with us.
- 4. Help us understand the purpose of the engagement, what we can influence and help us shape our views.
- 5. **Ensure** the engagement is **inclusive** and **remove barriers** for young people who want to take part.
- 6. **Respectfully** and **actively listen** to us and always **value** our opinions.
- 7. **Safeguard** us, and only share our views from the engagement with our consent.
- 8. **Communicate effectively** with us, using child friendly language, suitable social media and digital platforms, and other appropriate methods.
- 9. Keep us informed throughout the engagement process and feedback the outcome of the engagement to us.
- 10. Evaluate the engagement and its impact.
